Fund Commentary

The US Federal Reserve maintained its policy rate during its July meeting. The South African Reserve Bank's (SARB) Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) unanimously reduced the repo rate by 25bps, in line with market expectations. This resulted in the narrowing of the policy interest rate differential between Namibia (6.75%) and South Africa (7.00%) to 25bpts. The SARB further announced that it will move from an inflation target band (3.00% - 6.00%) to a lower target point (3.00%), resulting in firming of the South African money market and bond yield curves.

Namibian money market yields experienced a modest decline, with the Treasury Bill and Negotiable Certificate of Deposit (NCD) curves contracting by 2bpts and 3bpts, respectively. Conversely, the South African money market reflected a more pronounced adjustment, with yields contracting by 9bpts across the curve.

The fund does maintain its current allocation towards sovereign instruments to enhance diversification and optimize returns.


Income Declaration


The Pointbreak Institutional Money Fund is suitable for investors seeking a low risk investment that maximises income. It offers a high income yield, capital stability and good liquidity.

Investment Objective

The fund's objective is to achieve an investment return in excess of general money market instruments and funds, while ensuring a high degree of liquidity, capital preservation and below average risk. The fund invests with the four major banking groups in Namibia, the five major banking groups in South Africa, Nampost Namibia and the Namibian,- and South African Reserve Bank. Securities to be included in the portfolio consist of money market instruments, participatory interests in unit trust schemes, bank call and fixed deposits, fixed income securities, government bills and bonds, quality commercial paper and repurchase agreements.
